- 1) How can \$28,000 be invested, part at 4% annual interest and the remainder at 10% annual interest, so that the interest earned by the two accounts is equal at the end of the year?
- 2) How can \$70,000 be invested, part at 4% annual interest and the remainder at 10% annual interest, so that the interest earned by the two accounts is equal at the end of the year?
- 3) Kevin invested part of his \$10,000 bonus in a certificate of deposit that paid 6% annual interest, and the remainder in a mutual fund that paid 11% annual interest. If his total interest for that year was \$800, how much did Kevin invest in the mutual fund?

- 11) The owners of a candy store want to sell, for \$6 per pound, a mixture of chocolate-covered raisins, which usually sells for \$3 per pound, and chocolate-covered macadamia nuts, which usually sells for \$8 per pound. 15) Linda and Dave leave simultaneously from the same starting point biking in opposite directions. Linda bikes at 5 miles per hour and Dave bikes at 9 miles per hour. How long will it be until they are 30 miles apart from each other?

16) Linda and Dave leave simultaneously from the same starting point biking in opposite directions. Linda bikes at 6 miles per hour and Dave bikes at 9 miles per hour. How long will it be until they are 23 miles apart from each other?

17) Jeff starts driving at 45 miles per hour from the same point that Lauren starts driving at 60 miles per hour. They drive in opposite directions, and Lauren has a half-hour head start. How long will they be able to talk on their cell phones that have a 310-mile range?

18) Jeff starts driving at 65 miles per hour from the same point that Lauren starts driving at 40 miles per hour. They drive in opposite directions, and Lauren has a half-hour head start. How long will they be able to talk on their cell phones that have a 310-mile range?
